Description of this webinar:

Over two years after the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, European countries are now at a key juncture. Health services have changed rapidly and dramatically to respond to the health emergency, and many countries have now turned attention to recovery while continuing to register relatively significant numbers of COVID-19 cases.

As part of the '<u>State of Health in the EU</u>' (SoHEU) - a two-year recurring project that the European Commission has carried out in partnership with the OECD and the European Observatory on Health Systems and Policies since 2016 – this webinar will present a data-based account of the state of the health system in Slovakia from a comparative, EU-wide perspective.

Based on the key findings from <u>Slovakia's Country Health Profile 2021</u>¹ and the European Commission's <u>Companion Report 2021</u>, presenters and panellists will discuss:

1) how national health systems in Europe are sustaining positive changes and transformations developed in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, and

2) which government policies and investments in the area of health should be prioritized to support system recovery in the context of the looming threat of the pandemic.
